At the Planning Commission hearing on the proposed legislative amendment, testimony was provided that dispensaries are not allowed in any other historic district in Oregon. I've spoken with officials from Stayton, McMinnville and Oregon City; none of them have those bans in place. McMinnville has other regulations that essentially serve as an outright prohibition. But apparently, there is a dispensary two blocks from the McLoughlin House in Oregon City, which is just about the most historic building in the entire state.
