You can make payments and view your water/sewer account online at the following website https://cityofaurora.merchanttransact.com/. If you choose to pay your bill with a credit or debit card, there is a small convenience charge of \$3.50 for each transaction. This site also provides the option to sign up for electronic bill delivery.

- If there is a non-emergency item you would like to report please call 503-588-5032, Marion County non-emergency dispatch.
- If there is a water leak that you would like to report please call City Hall, 503-678-1283. If it is after hours, please report it to Public Works at 503-444-0670 or 503-519-0889 or call the non-emergency dispatch number, 503-588-5032 and they will contact public works
- The City is only responsible for repairs and water leaks in the city right-of-way, not in private yards.



Hard to believe it's time to prepare for another North Marion graduation ceremony. There are two changes in the leadership positions in our city. We have a new city recorder, Scott Jorgensen. Please come by city hall and say hello. Also, the Aurora Rural Fire District has hired a new chief, Josh Williams. Please also stop by the fire hall to say hi.



I am very pleased to announce that our very own Mary Lambert was awarded Office Manager of the Year at the OAWU conference. I would like to thank Mary for her dedication and many years of service to our city.

You may notice the construction of a new restaurant at Highway 99 and Bob's Avenue. It is very exciting to watch the building process. I hope everyone is looking forward to the grand opening.

Our city continues to invest in infrastructure. We have a \$50K grant from Business Oregon to repave some of our streets on the south side of town. Upgrades to our water and waste water systems make our town more efficient. A replacement of a water main next month along Highway 99 will reduce our water loss due to a damaged pipe. Over the last year, the public works department has located and fixed water leaks amounting to a reduction of over 20,000 gallons of water loss per day.

The Planning Commission is working hard on future development plans for Aurora. Please join in the discussions about Transportation Master Planning and Urban Growth Boundary updates. They meet the first Tuesday of each month at Aurora City Council Chambers.

Window Fall Prevention Keeping your kids safe!

Did you know the leading cause of injury for children are window falls? It accounts for 38% of all fall related injuries in children four and under. The rate of fall related injuries increases during the spring and summer as people open up their windows to get that fresh spring air in their home. But many don't realize that children can easily push out the bug screen that they feel will protect them from a fall. Children play, they may jump or climb on furniture near windows, or win-

dows might be low enough that a child could easily fall out. Screens may keep bugs out, but they won't keep children in. Many kids may think that leaning or pushing on screens is ok as they seem secure, but as soon as they push hard enough, out they go.

Prevent window falls by removing furniture such as chairs or couches away from open windows so children cannot reach them. Teach older children to stay clear of windows and to prevent younger children from playing near windows. And the best way to prevent falls is to never open windows more than four inches, and install a window stop to prevent it from being opened more than four inches. Be sure that the window stop can be removed by an adult in the event of a fire, and the window being needed for escape.
