PUBLIC SAFETY – We have a new Deputy in town! Deputy Bell has taken another position with the Salem schools as a School Resource Officer for several middle schools. Deputy Bill Ovchinnikov applied for the position and will be Aurora's deputy for the remainder of the contract period. The 2020 grant has been submitted and if awarded will be used to complete Filbert and Walnut streets as well as Orchard.

How prepared are you in case of a disaster? What do you need to know? What can we expect from each other? And do we know how to help?

This past spring a group of residents from Aurora took advantage of the CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) free basic training that was offered. Now those Aurora residents along with the support of North Marion CERT and the City of Aurora are taking it to the next level. The goal is to help our neighborhoods be prepared in the event of a disaster, such as a major earthquake that might cut us off from the services we have all come to depend on. We are forming a community action planning team called the Aurora Community Preparedness Team. We're in the planning stages now and looking for people representing all neighborhoods of Aurora to join us as we discuss some specific plans we can put in place before disaster strikes.

There will be a coffee shop, a special store, featured quilters and quilting demonstrations, and a raffle of a blue and white quilt made from last year's block contest.

Block Contest for the 2020 Quilt Show "2020 Visions of Joy"

What personally brings you joy? Let your creativity loose and show us in your block design!
Use quilting fabrics of your choice (novelty prints okay) as long as they are pre-washed 100% cotton. If you use white in the background, use a true white or white-on-white, not cream or ivory.

Size: 121/2" x 121/2"

To finish as a 12" x 12" block

Do not set blocks on point.

Block may be pieced and/or appliquéd but appliqué must be trimmed on back.

Please, no fusing or gluing of fabrics – too difficult to hand quilt.

Limit of two block entries per quilter.

Quilt Blocks due at the Old Aurora Colony Museum by Friday, October 18, 2019, 4 p.m.

The 20 winning quilt blocks will be assembled into the raffle quilt for the 2020 Quilt Show, 2020 Visions of Joy. The remaining blocks will also be assembled into additional quilts and wall hangings to be used for fundraising purposes.
