

If you decide not to go out, there are many ideas and tips on the internet for some safe yet fun alternatives to traditional trick-or-treating.

Halloween masks won't provide the safety a face covering provides. No matter how scary your costume mask is, wearing a face covering that covers your mouth and nose is still a good idea.

Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds before and after your outing. It's also a good idea to use hand sanitizer often.

HAPPY HOLIDAY SEASON from the Marion County Sheriff's Office! Below are a few tips to help make this time of year more safe and enjoyable for all;

Halloween safety tips... Consider starting during daylight hours... use glow stick, reflective bands and flash-lights... Look before crossing the street and stay on the sidewalk if possible and children should always be accompanied by an adult.

Aurora along with the City of Hubbard were hit with a rash of car "break-ins" (unlocked cars) recently. This is a reminder to remove valuables from your vehicles or keep them out of plan view when left in the vehicle. LOCK YOUR DOOR! This goes for your vehicles, homes, out building/ sheds etc... Bags of cans and other items of value should not be left in plain view from the street. If possible please place these items behind a fenced area or covered and out of view.

With the changing weather more folks will want to warm-up their vehicles before leaving for the day. Don't forget to lock doors when warming up vehicles. Vehicles left unattended while warming up are an easy target for car thieves. Also, with the days being shorter please check and make sure your exterior lights are in good working order. Lighting is a good deterrent to prevent unwanted persons coming onto your property.

It's always important to protect your property but more important to protect yourself.
