New City Recorder

The Aurora City Council voted unanimously at its Tuesday, August 11 meeting to hire Stuart Rodgers as the city's next Recorder.

Current City Recorder W. Scott Jorgensen announced last month that he is starting as the City Administrator for Rainier as of September 8.

Originally from Chula Vista, California, Rodgers moved to the small Oregon town of Jefferson and worked on a potato farm during summer vacations. This experience helped him learn Spanish and prepare for a two-year service abroad in Chile. Upon returning from South America, he focused on economics at Chemeketa Community College, transferred to Brigham Young University for a degree in political science, and then returned home to Oregon to obtain a Master's degree in Public Administration from Portland State University.



Rodgers got his start in local government through a Management Internship at the south coast city of Brookings and has completed economic development projects for the cities of Albany and Payson, Utah.

Through a variety of small business marketing ventures, his own buy-sell-trade operation and work for a Salem-based mortuary transport service, Rodgers relates well to business owners and the challenges they face. Most recently, he managed the Woodburn Area Chamber of Commerce, helping to grow the business association during a period of rebuilding.

Outside of work, Rodgers enjoys water sports and road trip adventures across Oregon and loves to spend time with family based in the Willamette Valley.

"The city is very fortunate to have found such a qualified individual to fill the position," Mayor Brian Asher said. "We are all looking forward to working together for the betterment of our city."

Rodgers started with the City of Aurora on Tuesday, August 25. Feel free to stop by City Hall to introduce yourself or find him out and about connecting with Aurora residents and businesses.

In February 2018, the Aurora City Council took a chance and voted to hire me on as the City Recorder. Even though I had worked in several small towns like Aurora throughout my career, this was my first time in this kind of role. I started one month later and hit the ground running. My approach was to create a culture based on quality customer service, with the hopes of helping the city move on a path towards fulfilling its tremendous potential.

The nearly two and a half years since then have been truly rewarding. It's been an honor to see several projects around town evolve from concepts on paper to reality. Together, we've celebrated the grand opening of Filbert's Farmhouse Kitchen. The Historical Society's preservation and research center has been another worthwhile addition. Portland Electrical Construction, Inc. is breaking ground on its commercial development. Conroy Classics should be doing the same in a matter of weeks. Peyton Circle is on track to begin new residential construction. Chugg Coffee should be opening very soon. At least six other commercial, residential and mixed use projects are also in the works.

I've thoroughly enjoyed working with the city council, as well as the volunteer members of the Planning Commission and HRB. I'm particularly enthused about the re-formed Parks Committee and all of its efforts to improve and enhance recreational opportunities for residents and visitors alike.

City staff is also top-notch in every respect. I'm proud of the teamwork and camaraderie. Hiring the public works crew has been another highlight, as they've done a great job and raised the level of professionalism of their department to an all-time high.

The City of Rainier has offered me the position of City Administrator and I have accepted. My last day with the City of Aurora was September 1.


