HAPPY HOLIDAYS from the Marion County Sheriff's Office.

At the request of our friends and neighbors in Aurora, I will have members from the Marion County Sheriff's Office Community Relations Unit (CRU) at the next Council meeting on January 12th to discuss the implementation of Neighbor Watch programs in our town. I would encourage anyone interested in joining a Neighborhood Watch to attend the meeting in-person or by phone to learn more.

Thefts from vehicles in and around the City of Aurora have continued to be a problem. This is a reminder to remove valuables from your vehicles or keep them out of plan view when left in the vehicle. Also, LOCK YOUR DOORS... this goes for your vehicles, homes, out building/ sheds etc... Bags of cans and other items of value should not be left in plain view from the street. If possible please place these items behind a fenced area or covered and out of view.

With the shorter days and cold weather coming more folks will want to warm-up their vehicles before leaving. Don't forget to lock doors when warming up vehicles (please don't lock your keys in your car). Vehicles left unattended while warming up are easy targets for car thieves. Also, with the daylight hours being shorter please check and make sure your exterior lights are in good working order. Lighting is a good deterrent from unwanted persons coming onto your property.

As always, if you see something suspicious please don't hesitate to call 911, or if you feel it's not an emergency please call the Marion County Sheriff's Office non-emergency line at 503-588-5032. You can also contact your local deputy, Bill Ovchinnikov at 503-991-7055.

This is compounded by the fact that Aurora is a rural community. In the case of a long-term or wide spread disaster, such as a major earthquake or prolonged power outage, we may be on our own for several months or longer. Because of this, we must be able take care of ourselves and our community until outside help arrives.

We are Aurora Community Preparedness, and our mission is to educate the people of Aurora on emergency preparedness, coordinate with and provide resources to the town in the event of a disaster.

In coordination with the city, we are planning public events and programs to educate the citizens and grow our organization. These events range from CPR/First Aid, gardening and canning, Survival skills, HAM radio communications, food & water storage, and more. These skills will help the citizens of Aurora prepare themselves and build a culture of preparedness for the community.

Another objective is to help the people of Aurora grow closer and stronger as a community through the Map Your Neighborhood Program. This can help identify people with extra or special needs that require more care, as well as people with vitally essential skills – i.e., medical, engineering, food preservation etc. Aurora Community Preparedness seeks to foster a community that is ready and resilient.
