

In the coming weeks a new water line will be installed down highway 99 from the post office past Portland Electric Construction's property. The line, with a larger capacity, will be easier to maintain and will add several new fire hydrants.

With this work the city's water supply will need to be turned off once and at night. You will have ample notice with a door hanger, with instructions for a boil water notice. This information will also be posted on the city's website, "I love Aurora page" and "All things Aurora "

It is always good to remind everyone that the mayor and city council member's as well as all the committee members are Volunteers. Their goal is to improve the community and the quality of life here in Aurora. None of them are paid in any financial way. Just from the heart.

Shake Alert is coming to the west coast. It is Early Warning System that detects significant earthquakes so quickly that alerts can reach many people before shaking arrives. Oregon rolls out delivery of alerts to wireless devices on 3/11/21. Check it out from the USGS.

tive process in the office. This is not costly and can actually assist you in making choices that are most appropriate for your property. For more information, ask an HRB member, city staff or read the manual for interesting and helpful tips.
