### Marion County Sheriff's Office- City of Aurora

From the Marion County Sheriff's Office we hope this letter finds everyone well! With the changing of the seasons, you should check exterior lighting to make sure it's in good working order. Good lighting is not only a great deterrent from theft around your properties but can also help you find your way around, if you find yourself outside after dark.

Reminder: Car "break-ins" have occurred again over the past few weeks. The Sheriff's Office received a couple of reports from inside the Aurora city limits but several other calls from surrounding areas outside the city too. Please pass this message along to lock doors/ windows to vehicles and outbuilding. Also, please try to remove any valuables from your vehicles.

Halloween is around the corner. Here are a few safety tips for both trick-or-treaters and drivers: Costume Safety-

All costumes, wigs and accessories should be fire-resistant

Fasten reflective tape to their costumes and bags, or give them glow sticks

#### Keep these tips in mind when your children are out on Halloween night-

A responsible adult should accompany young children on the neighborhood rounds
Plan and review a route acceptable to you
Agree on a specific time children should return home

- Teach your children never to enter a stranger's home or car
- Instruct children to travel only in familiar, well-lit areas and stick with their friends
- Tell your children not to eat any treats until they return home
- Children and adults are reminded to put electronic devices down, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street

#### Safety Tips for Motorists-

- Watch for children walking on roadways, medians and curbs
- Enter and exit driveways and alleys carefully
- At twilight and later in the evening, watch for children in dark cloth-

### **Halloween Fire Safety Tips**

Halloween is a fun and spooky time of year for kids. Make trick-or-treating safe for your little monsters with some easy safety tips.

- When out trick-or-treating, be sure your child carries a flashlight or glowstick as part of their costume. Be sure to have one vourself as well.
- Be sure to talk to your children about road and crossing safety. It's an exciting time of year and everyone should always look both ways before crossing the road.
- When using decorations in or around your home, avoid using items that may easily catch on fire such as dried flowers, cornstalks and papers. If used, be sure to keep them away from open flames and other heat sources such as light bulbs and heaters.
- In place of candles, use battery-operated lights that mimic candles, or a glow stick. If you do decide to use a real candle, use extreme caution. Be sure to watch small children at all times when candles
- Keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.
- Ensure all smoke and CO alarms are working in your home.

Decorations are the first thing to ignite in over 900 reported home fires each year. Two of every five of these fires were started by candles.
