### Notice of Historic Review Board Open Position

Are you a "visual" person, intrigued by your city's historic surroundings? Here's an opportunity to be a part of that by joining the City of Aurora's Historic Review Board (HRB). One position is open to a city resident who is either inside or outside of the historic district. Potential applicants can also live outside of the city with certain skills in construction, historic restoration or other related fields. The commitment involves one approximately two-hour meeting per month.

### **Upcoming Changes to Backflow Testing**

With the adoption of Ordinance No.498 the City will be implementing a program to ensure compliance with State mandated annual backflow device testing. Beginning in 2023 the City will be contracting with a Backflow Device tester who will complete testing of all devices installed within the City limits. After testing is completed, the testing fee will be included on each respective residents water bill. The city will notify residents if their device fails to pass the testing, and the resident will be responsible for having the device promptly repaired. This program will help ensure that we all have safe drinking water and help reduce the cost of annual testing. It will also relieve residents of the responsibility to schedule testing each year.

More detailed information will be provided via mail to all residents that currently have a backflow device installed on their property.

Hello from the Sheriff's Office. Even though it was late, it appears fall has finally arrived. With that being said, we would like to bring the changing road conditions to your attention. Now that it has started raining, roads will be slick, and drivers should use caution.

FINES DOUBLE IN WORK ZONES If you haven't noticed, ODOT contractors are performing work on Highway 99E, replacing sidewalk curb ramps to make them ADA compliant. Most of Highway 99E through the City is now marked as a construction zone and some moving violation fees double. For instance, exceeding the speed limit (ORS 811.111) 11-20 MPH is normally a presumptive fine of \$165.00 dollars. In the work zone it increases to \$325.00. I am not seeing very many city residents driving this fast, but I still wanted to bring this to everyone's attention.

And one last reminder, Halloween is just around the corner. Please be on the lookout for little ghouls and goblins in our neighborhoods. They will be looking for treats and may not be paying attention to vehicle traffic. The monsters may be hard to spot especially since day light is getting in short supply.

I hope everyone gets their fill of candy and enjoys the break from the heat.


