Notice of Budget Committee Vacancy

The City of Aurora has a vacancy for a three-year term on its Budget Committee. The term is from January 2022 thru December 2024..

The committee typically has two to four meetings between late April and early June to examine and approve the city's projected revenues and expenses for the fiscal year that begins on July 1st. It is a great way to be involved in your local government.

Potential applicants must be registered to vote in the City of Aurora and cannot be an officer, agent or employee of the city. To apply, please send a letter of interest to city hall or email Mary Lambert at finance@ci.aurora.or.us. Council will appoint the new member at the January 11, 2022 meeting.

Preparing for a More Resilient Future 2022 Public Works Bond Headed to Voters


The City Council is planning to refer a bond measure in February for the May 2022 ballot. This bond would **replace** the existing wastewater bond to fund the continued maintenance and modernization of the City's water and wastewater systems, and a community center.

The original wastewater bond passed in 1997 and funded construction of our wastewater system. This bond will be fully repaid in 2024. Built in part by residents, maintained by the City, and supported by taxpayers, our wastewater system has served residents well for the past 20 years.

The current bond has provided services for Aurora through its growth from a city of roughly 400 people to more than 1,100.

The City has been planning for the 2022 bond for years, prioritizing: wastewater, water, stormwater, and a community center. A breakdown of the projects is as follows:

Aurora Capital Improvement Projects



The proposed projects address shortcomings in the City's infrastructure and facilities, recently highlighted by extreme weather events. The September 2020 wildfires showed how we will likely face greater fire danger and need more water capacity to protect the community. The February 2021 ice storms and extreme heat in June 2021 highlighted the importance of an emergency shelter for residents who are unable to shelter in place during extreme weather.

Additionally, the proposed projects will allow the City to:

Avoid a maintenance backlog as costs get higher to maintain a failing system;

Increase capacity to meet the needs of our current population and business demands;

Ensure water supply, storage, and delivery.

If passed, the new bond will **replace** the current bond as it expires, retaining historic property tax rates. It will cost property owners an estimated \$3.00 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. If the bond does not pass, the existing tax would no longer be assessed and proposed improvement projects could be deferred or eliminated.
