Hello from the Sheriff's Office...

I would like to take a moment to introduce myself. My name is Pete Walker, and I am the new City of Aurora Contract Deputy. I have been a Deputy with the Enforcement Division of the Sheriff's Office for nine years. You may have seen me around when Dep. Ovchinnikov was not on duty. Before coming to Marion County, I worked at the Polk County Sheriff's Office for four years, as a Patrol Deputy. Before that, I was a Reserve Officer with the City of Keizer. If you see me out and about, please feel free to come up and chat.

For those of you who haven't heard, Deputy Ovchinnikov accepted a new position with the Traffic Safety Team, within the Sheriff's Office.

I have several events planned for the upcoming year (more to come later) and look forward to serving the citizens of Aurora.

I will be providing a crime prevention section in the newsletter. This month will cover vehicle breakins.

- Never leave valuables in plain sight. Lock valuables in the trunk or out of view. This includes the vehicle title.
- Do not leave your keys in the vehicle. Twenty percent of stolen vehicles had the keys inside.
- Close windows and lock your vehicle. Confirm it is locked by physically checking the handle or visually noting the locks are in the locked position.
- Park your vehicle in a well-lit area.
- Never leave your vehicle unattended while it is running. This is a violation of Oregon law. ORS 811.585

Document your vehicle license plate, vehicle identification number year, make, model, and color. This information can be found on your Oregon vehicle registration card or insurance card. I would encourage everyone to report suspicious activity by calling the Non-Emergency number at 503 588 5032 or 911 if the situation warrants it. 911 should be used for any serious medical problem, any type of fire, any lifethreatening situation (fights, armed persons, residence burglary, etc.) or to report in progress crimes. Again, I look forward to serving the citizens of Aurora.



The Aurora City Council approved at its Tuesday, February 8, 2022 meeting the referral of a ballot measure for \$7,100,000 with an estimated tax levy rate of \$2.90 per \$1,000 of assessed property value for a May 17, 2022 election.
