## **New Backflow Testing Program**

City of Aurora has entered into a contract with Hempel Backflow Testing to provide backflow testing of all devices in the City.

Testing was mostly completed during the Month of May. If you had a personal device that was tested the charge will be reflected on this months water bill.

If you were previously on an annual service with another company you should contact them to cancel future testing to avoid additional charges.
