Notice of Budget Committee Vacancy

The City of Aurora has one vacancy for a three-year term on its Budget Committee. The term will expire in January 2026.

The committee typically has two to four meetings between late April and early June to examine and approve the city's projected revenues and expenses for the fiscal year that begins on July 1st. It is a great way to be involved in your local government.

Applicants must be registered to vote in the City of Aurora and cannot be an officer, agent, or employee of the city.

Hello from the Sheriff's Office. I have been receiving reports from citizens that crimes and suspicious incidents are going unreported. I would like to remind everyone there are several ways to reports incidents to the Sheriff's Office.

- Public Safety Citizens Service Portal (https://www.co.marion.or.us/SO/Pages/OnlineReporting.aspx) gives community members the ability to share information at their convenience instead of waiting for direct contact by a deputy. The online reporting system is reserved for incidents with no suspect information that occurred in response areas covered by the Marion County Sheriff's Office. Incidents that are eligible for this new service are limited to: • Hit and Run (no injury to person) • Theft from a Building • Theft of Services • Graffiti • Suspicious Activity • Lost or Mislaid Property • Theft of Mail • Telephonic Harassment • Identity Theft • Vandalism • Fraud • Shoplifting • Theft from a motor vehicle .
- Community members who would prefer to report incidents by calling our non-emergency number (503-588-5032) and speaking with a deputy directly will continue to have that option.
- If you believe your incident is an emergency call 911!

If you have any questions please feel free to contact me or flag me down when you see me in the city.





New Backflow Testing Program

City of Aurora has entered into a contract with Hempel Backflow Testing to provide backflow testing of all devices in the City.

If you have a device installed on your property you will be receiving a letter in the mail providing details of this program.

If you think you have a device and do not receive a letter, please contact City Hall.

Update Your Contact Info

If you've had a change of contact information (email address, landline, or cell phone number) please provide City Hall

with current contact information. It is important for the City to have good contact information to be able to reach residents in the event of an emergency. Thank you!

Emergency and Non-Emergency Call Out Information

- If you have an emergency call 911.
- If there is a non-emergency item you would like to report please call 503-588-5032, Marion County non-emergency dispatch.
- If there is a water leak that you would like to report please call City Hall, 503-678-1283. If it is after hours, please report it to Public Works at 971-930-3597 or 503-409-1434 or call the non-emergency dispatch number, 503-588-5032 and they will contact public works
- The City is only responsible for repairs and water leaks in the city right-of-way.
