

BUDGET TIME

The Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget meetings began with the budget message and proposed budget introduced at 7 pm April 26, 2023, at City Hall. The second meeting, scheduled on May 17th, will include a public hearing on the spending of State Revenue Share funds. There

are no restrictions on these funds, but it is suggested they are used to enhance the city. The amount budgeted this year is \$14,000. The proposed budget includes a transfer of \$6,000 of those funds to the Aurora Colony Days Fund with the balance of \$8,000 to be used on various "beautification" projects. If you have a device installed on your property you will be receiving a letter in the mail providing details of this program.


Emergency and Non-Emergency Call Out Information
