The Sheriff's Office hopes everyone had a safe and joyful holiday.

As I'm sure you have seen, the Sheriff's Office radar trailer was deployed around the City for several weeks. I have completed the project and wanted to give you a summary of what was noted. The trailer was in five different locations listed below.

Using this trailer was a first for me and I learned quite a bit. For instance, at Hwy 99E/ Orchard Ave NE, the trailer was also reading vehicles in the 50 MPH Zone which is why 81.29% were over the speed limit. While the vehicle count is correct, the speeds are higher than expected due to the 50 MPH zone. I also wanted to clarify what "Pace Speed" is. The program calculated what an acceptable speed is in each zone. Then the program calculated who was within the "pace."
