New Fire Engines to be in service soon

A little more than a year ago, firefighters and Aurora Fire Board of Directors worked to obtain funding and design two new fire engines to replace units that are 30 years old. Although the units have been received and have been stored in our Aurora



Station, it takes time to get equipment properly placed, get firefighters trained to utilize the equipment and hose lines, and get the operators used to driving and operating an entirely new fire unit. Not only does it drive different than the previous fire engines, it has newer technology and controls to operate the fire and foam pumps. Firefighters have been working hard to get this training completed. Once we have enough firefighters trained, the fire engines will be put to work in mid to late July responding to many different types of emergencies. Each Fire Engine is assigned to its own station with one assigned to the Aurora Fire Station and the other assigned to the Donald Fire Station. Backyard Burning Closed as of June 15th

Reminder to residents of Marion County. **Backyard burning will not be allowed from June 15th to as late as October 1st**. Burning closures may be extended by the Fire Chief if fire danger levels remain increased beyond October 1st. Agricultural burning is for active farms and nurseries and regulated under the Department of Agriculture, so you may see some burning from farms and nurseries in the area be-
