BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY REMINDER

With school starting before we know it, I would like to remind everyone about the increased school bus traffic, children walking to school, and busy school zones with drop-off and pick-up areas becoming congested and busy. It's very important for drivers to slow down and be aware for the presence of children – especially during times when school is beginning or ending.



If dropping off children, please remember to utilize the school's drop-off and pick-up procedures. Each year more children are struck in school zones than any other area. Do not double park; it blocks visibility for other children and vehicles. Never load or unload children across the street from a school and carpool to reduce the number of vehicles at the school.

Please be courteous to school busses and never pass a school bus with flashing red lights. School busses utilize these red lights to warn motorists to stop and watch for children. Not only is it illegal to pass a bus with flashing red lights, it's dangerous to the children and other motorists.

It is finally here! You can now make payments online for your water/sewer bills at the following website <u>https://cityofaurora.merchanttransact.com/</u>. Please register your account even if you don't plan to use the payment portal because you will be able to see your account, look at your balance, track your usage and a lot more. If you decide you want to use it for payments there will be a small convenience charge of \$3.50 for each transaction. You will also be able to sign up for electronic bills or both paper and electronic which ever suits your needs.

You will need to have your full 9 digit account number located in the upper right hand corner of your bill (in account information). Example: 001234-000.

**** ATTENTION CITY RESIDENTS ****

This is a reminder that with the growing season upon us, each property maintains the sidewalk area abutting the street at their property. This includes residences throughout the city as well as business properties.

At the present time, many trees are currently overhanging the street, not allowing the street cleaner to effectively clean the street. In order to keep our streets clean these trees need to be trimmed to a clearance height of 11 feet.

Also, as it is now fire season, please be sure to keep your grass and bushes trimmed away from any structures so as not to pose any fire danger. Dry grass above a height of 10 inches is considered to be a fire risk.

If you have any questions about the area in front of your home or business, please call city hall. The city's appearance encourages commerce as well as fostering civic pride.
