Mayor's Corner

Summer has arrived, delivering our first string of 90+ degree days. The city has brought our third well online. Usage peaked at the same summer daily rate as last summer for similar temperature days. I want to encourage everyone to use water wisely as it is a natural resource that is limited. Even though our part of Oregon is not in a severe drought region, 19 counties (more than half) are. This month, Governor Brown stated, "Although this year's drought has drawn attention to Oregon's water needs, it is important to recognize that even in normal water years, Oregon faces water challenges." Oregon communities need to not look only at the current season's water situation, but the long term solutions as well.

Residents can help our local water conservation efforts by remembering to water in the late evenings or early morning, watering lawns every other day and watering only as much as needed. Many cities in the Willamette Valley are doing their part in investing in modern water storage and usage technology. Our city can make a contribution to this effort by using this limited resource wisely and with foresight to the future of our region.

Once again I had the honor of being on stage for this year's North Marion High School graduation ceremonies. This year's class of 136 has 22% going to a 4-Year college, 38% going to a 2-Year college or Professional /Technical school, and 6% going to the military. The Oregonian reports that the State of Oregon had a 72% graduation rate in 2014. This year's North Marion rate is 87%, with more than half of the graduates going on to higher education. We congratulate the North Marion class of 2015 for achieving this milestone in their life.

A team of volunteers are working hard on this year's Aurora Colony Days. Concerts in the Park will begin in July with the big day on August 8th. Street Faire and parade volunteer help is still needed. This year will also feature a fund raising event from the Aurora Historical Society at the end of the Street Faire. Please come and enjoy the events and support our local businesses.
