If you receive a blue water bill you live in the Historic District. If your to-do list is for any outside project including, but not limited to, painting, landscaping worth \$2500 or more, fencing, windows, or roofing, you must get approval to do so prior to beginning your project. Please plan ahead. Come by City Hall or go on our web-site to obtain an application for your project approval. We have made it easier to get your painting project approved. Just come by City Hall with your paint samples and staff can approve your painting projects.

Also, especially at this time of year, Public Works is requesting an 18 inch buffer around each water meter for access. Your trim job will be nicer than ours.

The Aurora Fire District Spot - Window Safety

Windows play a vital role in home safety, serving as a secondary escape route in the event of a fire or other emergency, but they can also pose a risk for a fall if safety measures are not followed. Follow these guidelines to prevent window-related injuries in the home:

- Keep windows closed and locked when children are around;
- When opening windows for ventilation, open windows that children cannot reach;
- Don't rely on insect screens to prevent a fall, as they are designed to provide ventilation and not to prevent a child's fall from a window;
- Keep furniture, or anything children can climb, away from windows;
- Determine your family's emergency escape plan and practice it regularly;
- Make sure nothing is blocking or preventing a window from being opened in case of an emergency.
