Is Your Business Prepared If The Power Goes Out?

*Put together a business outage kit

Flashlights

Battery powered radio & clock

Car adaptors/chargers for cell phones and laptops

Emergency numbers, including PGE outage numbers

Extra batteries

*Plan For Equipment

Know how to shut off power to equipment.

If you use cash registers, have a non electric alternative.

Protect computer systems with surge protectors & automatic backup programs.

If you have an emergency lighting system, make sure it's in good working order.

If you are using a portable generator, read the instruction manual and follow all safety rules. Avoid Deadly Mistakes!

*Talk with Employees

Train your team so they know what to do if business loses power. If it's critical for your business to remain open during a storm, encourage your employees to have an outage plan for home and options to get to work in bad weather.

Home Address Signs — Can We Find You?

Every second counts when Firefighters, Police, and medical personnel are responding to an emergency 911 call. The Aurora Fire District is concerned about locating people during their time of need. Please take a moment to check your address sign for proper identification of your residence. This could be the difference in saving or losing lives and property.

The address sign should be clearly visible from the street. Numbers should be 3-4" in height. When placing numbers on your mailbox, please be sure that there are numbers on both sides. When placing numbers on your house please be sure that they are a contrasting color from your house, and easily seen from the street.
