#### ON PATROL

Well it's been one full month in the City of Aurora. I have been getting around to meeting all of the folks who work and live here. So if you see me in town, feel free to stop and talk. I can always make time.

This month I would like to send a warning out to everyone, and remind you to be cautious of scammers. It is a big problem these days and unfortunately there is not much that anyone can do about it. This is because most scammers are from out of the country. As you can imagine tracking someone down in East Asia is almost impossible.

So how do you recognize a scam? Well, first off, if it seems too good to be true, it probably is. You are probably not going to get a free cruise for just doing a survey. These folks want money and before you know it you have bought several thousand dollars worth of Time Share property in Southern Africa. Major Corporations will never contact you to try and sell you any services. These are multi- Billion dollar corporations and they do not need to solicit services. They run commercials. So if you didn't contact the company and request service, you probably don't need it.

Your loved one is most likely not in a Taiwan Prison needing bail money. If you receive a call like this, hang up and contact your family. First off you would not be getting a call from the police in Taiwan (or wherever), You would receive a call from the U.S. Consulate or a family member. Do not send them any money.

Never, ever, ever, ever, ever, ever, EVER! Give your credit card information to anyone over the phone, unless you know who the person is and have done business with them in the past. The ability to clone your card and obtain your personal information from this number can happen before you even get off the phone. By the time you realize your credit is ruined; you will be thousands of dollars in debt and spend the next 10-15 years trying to correct your credit.

If you have any questions on scams, or if you believe you were a victim of a scam, please give me a call and I will help you out the best I can.

### Message from the Planning Commission

The Planning Commission and the Historic Review Board are updating the regulations for development within our National Historic District, in response to concerns expressed by citizens and businesses in recent years. Under the current code, all development within the District must comply with use restrictions and development standards in Title 16, other use restrictions and development standards in Title 17, and the Design Review Guidelines for Historic District Properties. This includes new construction, and remodeling or additions to homes and businesses that are not generally considered historic, even though they are located within the Historic District.

The current proposal recommends two key changes. First, the design standards and criteria in the Design Review Guidelines for Historic District Properties are being moved into Title 17 so they will all be in one place. The standards and criteria are also simplified, so that the total number of pages of regulations is reduced by two thirds. The Design Review Guidelines include a wealth of historic information that all residents of the District should be aware of, and the idea is to separate that historical and general information from the actual requirements for permits. As proposed, the Guidelines will become advisory only. There are no changes proposed regarding allowed uses.

Second, all buildings and properties within the District are currently subject to the Design Review Guidelines, even if the buildings are not historic. The proposal is to add new protections for our crucial Colony and Post-Colony structures, which are those built in 1920 or earlier. For buildings constructed in later years, and for new construction, simpler standards will apply, that are intended to respect and reflect the traditional form of the Historic District, while eliminating current restrictions that treat these newer buildings just like the genuinely historic ones. Watch future newsletters for information on public events and hearings, and let us know your thoughts.

#### **Aurora Colony Historical Society**

The Aurora Colony Historical Society is proud to have been chosen by the Oregon Humanities to host a DISCUSSION ABOUT THE ROLE OF INDIVIDUALISM AND VOLUNTEERISM IN A DE-MOCRACY. The April 14 event is part of Oregon Humanities' statewide Conversation Project.

Individualism and volunteerism have special significance for Americans, and yet the two ideas are often topics of animated debate. According to the 19<sup>th</sup> century author Alexis de Tocqueville, individualism rightly understood and a healthy sense of volunteerism may be keys to democracy's success and to good citizenship.

This is the focus of "American Character: The Power of Individualism and Volunteerism," a free conversation with Southern Oregon University professors Prakash Chenjeri and Daniel Morris on Sunday, April 14<sup>th</sup> at 2 pm at the Old Aurora Colony Museum. This program is hosted by the Aurora Colony Historical Society and sponsored by Oregon Humanities.

Chenjeri is an associate professor of philosophy and director of the Honors Program at Southern Oregon University, where he has been teaching since 1995. He is a member of several professional organizations, including the American Association Philosophy Teachers, and serves on the Ethics Committee at Ashland Community Hospital.

Morris is professor of French and director of the Arts and Humanities Council at Southern Oregon University, where he has taught since 1982. A member of several professional organizations, he has a Ph.D. in Romance languages (French) from the University of Oregon.
