The biggest change we will see is in City Hall, where 3 (of 6) staff will be retiring at the end of the calendar year. We are working through the process of re-organizing staff functions and interviewing potential candidates. Some city services will be adjusted to maintain a balanced budget. I will keep you posted through the newsletter. Please come to our monthly city council meetings (2nd Tuesday of the month) as well to stay informed on city matters.

The City Council welcomes Kris Sallee as our newest council member, and Tara Weidman as our newest member of the Planning Commission. There is one open position on the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission is working on a number of land use issues with respect to doing business in the city. I encourage citizens to participate in the process, which uses the city's Action /

This month, the Oregon Economic Development Association has honored the "North Marion Enterprise Zone" with their "Outstanding Collaborative Partnerships" award. For those not familiar, the North Marion Enterprise Zone is a collaborative project with the cities of Aurora, Donald, and Hubbard. Business Oregon has used the Enterprise Zone concept to promote economic development for many years. The North Marion Enterprise Zone was approved by the state in *Date change both months May of this year. This project, along with our partnership with SEDCOR (Salem, OR) and the Mid-Willamette Valley COG are large parts of our economic development strategy for Aurora.

The City Code has been updated with regard to the Historic District (Title 17). This new section will take effect mid-November. Please note this change if vou live or have a business in the historic district. You will know you are in the historic district if you receive a water bill on colored paper. There are several changes to building requirements and business restrictions.

I will be providing updates through the newsletter and the Woodburn Independent over my tenure. The "Aurora Notification and Alert" will also be used. It is my hope that P2 the citizens of Aurora will work together to make our town the best it can be, and welcoming to all who visit.

The North Marion School District has proposed a Local Option Levy Measure (24-355) on the November ballot. This measure asks voters to consider a \$0.74/\$1000 levy to allow the district to improve curriculum, safety, and classroom environments in all buildings. The levy will add \$583,336 to the operating budget, as well as qualify the district for a state matching grant of \$309,168. 



NOTICE OF CITY WATER FLUSHING

Starting on the third week of November 2013 and continuing on the third week of odd numbered months, the city will be flushing water lines in all sections of the city. During this week, you may notice slightly discolored water as the flushing will help clean the lines of sediment. As the program continues, the discoloration should reduce to negligible amounts. The city will continue the program throughout the year(s) with the possible exception of July, depending on summer water usage and aquifer levels. The goal is to provide clear water throughout all sections of the system.



Every second counts when firefighters, police, and medical personnel are responding to an emergency 911 call. The Aurora Fire District is concerned about locating people during their time of need. Please take a moment to check your address sign for proper identification of your residence. This could be the difference in saving or losing lives and property.

The address sign should be clearly visible from the street. Numbers should be 3-4" in height. When placing numbers on your mailbox, please be sure that there are numbers on both sides. When placing numbers on your house please be sure that they are a contrast-ing color from your house, and easily seen from the street.

Scheduled for early November through December 31st, this popular exhibit provides another look at some of the precious heirlooms such as vintage photographs, quilts, and unique household items. Admission for museum members is free.
