

Housing Rehabilitation Grants

A Housing rehabilitation program, last used in the City of Aurora in early 2000, is being revitalized.

The City of Aurora has funding for single family homeowners who meet income guidelines to apply for the low interest loans for various housing rehabilitation repairs and upgrades. Eligible projects include basic structural repairs like roofs and gutters, plumbing, heating system, and/or weatherization.

The loan program is available to homeowners within the city limits with low-to-moderate incomes as defined by the county's median income. For example, one-person household income could not have exceeded \$33,600 in 2011 and 1 two-person household income could not have exceeded \$38,400 in 2011.

Loans are typically set at a 3% for 3 years and repaid when house is sold, the title transferred, or the use changes. The home must be insured in order to qualify, the owner must live in the home, and maximum loans are set at \$25,000.

In 2007 there were more than 236,000 reported bicycle-related injuries. Head injury is the leading cause of death in bicycle crashes.

Please take the time to review theses safety tips with all friends and family members. Theses are some quick simple tips to help ensure that your summertime walking and bicycle riding adventures are fun and safe!

Children under 10 should ride on sidewalks or safe areas only like a bike path. Teens may ride in the street, riding with traffic, after they learn the rules of the road.

Teach children to always come to a complete stop before entering a driveway, path or sidewalk. Look left, right, and left again for other bikes, cars, or pedestrians.

Children should walk, not ride a bike across the street, and cross only with a grown-up. Grown-ups and older children should be role models and set a positive example by practicing safe street-crossing rules.
